1. Create Your Masterpiece ~ 2009, Mixed Media on Masonite Panel



Mixed media panel that incorporates some of Michele’s favorite techniques; needle felting, painting on silk and thread painting. This piece empowers the viewer to go out and “make your own masterpiece!”

2. Shabbat @ Matisse’s ~ Painting on Silk ~**SOLD**



This painting on silk was inspired by Matisse’s masterpiece “The Dessert:Harmony in Red”. Substituting dessert with challah and wine, this image depicts a common scene from many Jewish homes around the world on Erev Shabbat/Yom Tov.

3. Peace Torah ~ 2010, Mixed Media on Paper



This whimsical painting illustrates a Torah is a Tree of Life: “It is a Tree of Life to all who grasp it, and whoever holds onto it is happy; its ways are ways of pleasantness, and all paths are peace”. (Proverbs 317-18)

4. Pomegranate Party ~ 2016, Mono printed paper collage



Pomegranates are a universal symbol of abundant goodness; mono-printed papers were used to create this whimsical collage of a “pomegranate party”

5. Star Dove ~ 2007, Painting on Silk



A dove, formed from Magen Davids (Jewish Stars) is both symbolic of the Jewish People and an emblem for peace.

6. Dancing Around Jerusalem ~ 2008, Painting on Silk



This colorful painting on silk depicts dancers joyfully celebrating in Jerusalem. Jerusalem is often depicted as a city with many layers; one level built on the top of another layer. Conquest after conquest, constantly rebuilding to form the city we see today.



7. Hope for Equality~ 2017, Mixed Media Painting

This image was created specifically for the Calendar Project; it depicts a group of teens praying together at the Kotel.



8. City of Peace~ Painting on Silk

This painting on silk depicts the multilayers of Jerusalem. Also known as the City of Peace, this painting symbolizes the hope that one day the world will achieve a universal peace.



9. Hanukiah~ 1999, Painting on Silk

This painting on silk depicts all of the classic symbols of Hanukkah.



10. Fruit of the Tree ~ 2013, Mixed Media Painting **SOLD**

This mixed media collage, whimsically illustrates "the fruit of the tree" with hearts, apples and pomegranates.



11. Tikkun Olam ~ 2014, Mixed Media Painting

This mixed media collage, was created with paint, ink and hand made paper. The image illustrates the concept of Tikkun Olam - repairing the world. This ancient concept teaches us that it is the job of humanity to heal, repair and transform the world.



12. A Prayer for Hope in Monet's Garden~ 2002 ~ Acrylic Painting on Canvas

This acrylic painting was inspired by Monet's series of paintings of his garden in Giverny. A beautiful, quiet place to pray for peace...



13. Whole New World ~ 2013, Pyrography, Ink on Wood

This painting on wood, features a Tree of Life, with its roots firmly planted on earth, and its branches reaching towards heaven.



15. Homeward Bound ~ Painting on Silk

The silhouettes of the camels against the fireworks in the desert night sky, creates this a magical image.



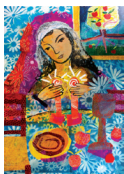
16. Late Afternoon Reflections ~ 2001~ Painting on Plexi glass

The technique of painting on glass illuminates the autumn colors glowing in the golden autumn sunshine during Tashlich.



17. Etyz Chayim ~ 2016~ Mono printed paper Collage

Inspired by the work of the stained glass master, Tiffany, mono-printed papers were collaged together to create an Etyz Chayim...Tree of Life.



17. Eishes Chayil ~ 2016~ Mono printed paper Collage

Drawing inspiration from Matisse, this soulful art paper collage, depicts a woman in deep meditative thought, as she lights the candles and welcomes *Shalom Bayit*, Peace in her home.



18. Four Seasons of Peace ~2015~ Mono printed paper Collage

Mixed media and mono printed paper collage; depicts a tree displaying the colors, patterns and textures of the seasons.



19. Filigree Doves~ 2012 ~ Pyrography with Ink on Wood

This view of the world from above, was inspired by the late Israeli astronaut, Ilan Ramon who said "from space the world seemed united".



21. Garden Fresh ~ Mixed Media Collage~

A Picasso inspired mixed media collage, shows the summer's wonderful bounty.



22. Life Gives you Lemons ~ Mixed Media Collage~

Mixed media study of lemons.



23. Poms, Apple and Shofar ~ 2015 ~ Mixed Media Collage

This playful mixed media collage, created with an unexpected mix of handmade papers blends together to form a whimsical image.



24. Shalom ~ 2015 ~ Mixed Media Collage

Merchandise tags make the perfect repeating element in this mixed media Shalom collage.



25. Honey Talks~ Mixed Media Painting

Inspired by Andy Warhol's *Coke Bottle Series*, which took a mainstream item and converted it into a piece of art, Michele takes two everyday items (that relate to Rosh Hashanah) and repeats them in series to create a piece of art.



26. Seven Species ~ Mixed Media Painting

The Seven Species are depicted in this mixed media collage; which is made from nature prints, paintings and textures.



27. Tree of Life ~ Paint on Glass

This image of The Tree of Life was painted on plexi-glass to emulate a stained glass window. The prominent bright yellow, a common element in stained glass windows, creates a sense of enlightenment and positivity.



28. Hands of Love ~ 2012 ~ Mixed Media Collage

This playful mixed media collage, illustrates the concept: "Hands of love create peace".



29. L'chayim ~ Painting on Silk

This painting on silk depicts a group of children standing together to form a Magen David. Their shofar blasts echo the prayer for a year of peace.



30. Honey Cake, Tea and Matisse ~ 2001 Painting on Silk

This painting on silk was inspired by one of Matisse's fauvist still lifes. Changing the fruit to pomegranates, and the cake to classic honey cake, this image becomes a common scene in many Jewish homes at the beginning of the new year.



31. Colors of the Wind ~ 2013 Pyrography and ink on wood

The combination of pyrography and brilliant color creates a magical tree standing proud in the night sky; with its limbs reaching toward heaven and its roots firmly planted on the ground.



32. Tikvah ~ 2017 ~ Mixed Media Collage ~ 360.00

Mono-printed and handmade papers are collaged together to create an image illustrating the hope for everlasting peace.



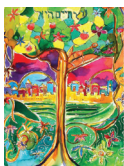
33. All Roads Lead to Peace ~ 2016 ~ Mixed Media Collage

Inspired by Matisse's paper cuts, this mono-printed and handmade papers collage illustrates the hope that "all roads (will) lead to peace".

Hot melted wax was used to create this icy winter scene of a tree in Vermont, filled with organic strokes and lines.



35. A Tree Grows in Jerusalem ~ 2014 ~ Pyrography and Ink on Paper

This colorful painting was inspired by the stained glass art of Louis Comfort Tiffany. The iconic image of the Tree of Life, combined with Jerusalem in the background illustrates if you have Torah, you have life!
